3. Del Mike Griffith was guest speaker at 28 May membership meeting. Very informative talk on State legislation concerning veterans. Especially insightful remarks concerning the implications of Maryland's budget deficit.

Legislative Affairs: Bob Brown**VA Updates**

1. Baltimore VAMHCS is undergoing façade renovation. Sidewalks will be closed in places. Project will complete by EOY.
2. 45000 appointments completed in April, the most ever.
3. Clinical
 - a. VA is working for approval to add robotics in some of the operating rooms.
 - b. Weight loss programs are being expanded at the VA. This includes some medication prescription and appointments in the community. Contact the VAMHCS for more details.
4. Homeless Program
 - a. The FY 25 Homeless goals are to place 761 veterans in permanent housing. So far 366 have been housed. 15 have returned to homelessness.
 - b. There is a goal of 614 engagements with unsheltered homeless veterans. So far they have reached 297.
5. June 11 Claims clinic at Anne Arundel Community College. See the VAMHCS website for details.
6. Home and Community Based Care representatives are asking that veterans apply to get into the VA healthcare system before they need long term, in home, nursing home, etc. care. Generally speaking, a veteran must first be in the VA Healthcare system and usually at a 70% service-connected rating for these services. Too many veterans wait until they need the care immediately, but it takes a long time to have a claim adjudicated and then apply for care.

MOAA Legislative

MOAA State Legislative Exchange Forum mentioned that we have been given the opportunity to provide input to the Defense-State Liaison Office to shape future issues.

a. To be considered, your input MUST be submitted to Harold E. Cooney no later than June 15.

b. They will consolidate the inputs by looking for a common thread and submit three or four items to MC&FP following our 15 July Forum meeting. Send it to me as Don is out of the net for several weeks.

The format for input is:

Problem: A one to two paragraph narrative capturing the overall gist or theme of the policy priority the states should adopt for military service members and their families. Define the problem in terms of threats and opportunities for DOD.

Current State Legislation / Best Practices: Examples and citations to enact state statutes which define the desired outcome and are perceived to be the best practice to solve the problem. If you don't have current legislation, do some research to find examples. Reach out to Harold if you need some help.

Please crosscheck your input with DSLO: Reach out to your RL, if you have a relationship, or check the DSLO website to ensure your proposed issue isn't already on their list.
